



The following is Facility usage rules for the use of FC Lakeside's Cold Pool Lane facility. Following FA, GFA, Tewkesbury Borough Council, Government and our Insurers requirements:

The document is fact based and a summary of our Risk Assessment of CPL

- Masks **MUST** be worn in the building, no mask, no entry
- Sanitize stations will be available again on entry and exit to the pitches and building
- One person to enter building at a time (or one child and one parent)
- The toilets are not for use of adults. They are bubbled to each session, 3 sessions at once, toilet A, B or C allocated to each session. They are not public toilets either. Toilets open 30 mins before and 30 mins after each session only for the use of players and coaches.
- No spectators are allowed at grassroots football, only players and staff
- One parent/guardian is allowed to stay per youth player for the session/match
- Social distancing must be followed in the outside spaces by parents and all users
- Changing rooms must not be used except in the case of an emergency
- The kitchen will not be in use and no café will be operational until the next stage
- Track and trace is in place and as a facility provider the FA states we **MUST** work with the NHS Track and Trace system. The QR code will be present and the manual register will be available. Session coaches will need to keep a record of their players and adults.
- There will be a basic one way system it's important that there isn't a congested gathering in front of the building.
- Coaches/users at the end of a session will need to use anti bac wipes to wipe down touch points on their allocated toilet block. Wipe down handles, taps, seats etc. They will be cleaned also in between.
- Parking must be sensible as social distancing in the car park will be required
- Windows in the building will be opened also to allow for ventilation.
